

A Message From Fr. Larry



Saint Teresa of Calcutta visited Australia. A new recruit to the monastery in Australia was assigned to be her guide and “gofer” during her stay. The

young man was so thrilled and excited at the prospect of being so close to this special woman. He dreamed of how much he would learn from her and what they would talk about. But during her visit, he became frustrated. Although he was constantly near her, he never had the opportunity to say one word to St. Teresa. There were always other people for her to meet. Finally, her tour was over, and she was due to fly to New Guinea. In desperation, the friar had his opportunity to speak to St. Teresa. He said to her, “If I pay my own fare to New Guinea, can I sit next to you on the plane so I can talk to you and learn from you?” St. Teresa looked at him. “You have enough money to pay airfare to New Guinea?” she asked. “Oh, yes,” he replied eagerly. “Then give that money to the poor,” she said.

Now is the Time to Invest in the Future of Our Faith Community

How Much Are We Being Asked to Invest in Our Faith Community?

Each person or family is asked to make an equal sacrifice — not an equal commitment. While there is no set amount, we suggest that each household consider committing five percent (5%) of its total annual family income each year for the three years of the campaign.

Update on Our 2013 Together We Build Campaign

The end of our **Together We Build Campaign** is June. We are getting close to collecting the total amount committed in 2013. We ask parishioners to do what they can to complete their commitments by June 1. If you need more time or if you need to change your level of commitment, just call Jenifer in the parish office. She would be happy to make any changes to your commitment you need.

For those who fulfill their commitment to the 2013 campaign, St. Luke's would like to recognize your sacrifice by including your name on a permanent display that will be prominently displayed in our parish. The display may be a donor tree or a stained glass window. You may request that your name not be displayed if you wish. Just let the office know.



The Campaign Steering Committee has set the parishioner goal for the campaign at \$1.5 million.

Campaign Q & A

Q: It appears that the priority of the money raised is going toward the school. Is this true?

It depends upon how much money parishioners contribute to the campaign. The goal is for the parishioners to contribute \$1.5 million to the campaign. The first \$1 million raised will be matched by the Lambertis, bringing us to a possible total of \$2.5 million. It appears that the school is being favored because the Lamberis have requested that their \$1 million go directly to the school. Since we plan to spend only the first \$1.5 of the total raised on the school, of which, \$1 million is the Lamberti's money, this means only \$500,000 of the money parishioners contribute will go to the school. The remaining \$1 million of the money raised by the parish is going to the church and parking. Everything we receive over the \$1.5 million in parish contributions will go to the school and additional parking.




Q: Can I change my level of commitment if I need to?

Yes. Just call Jenifer in the parish office and request a change at any time.

Q: Can I donate non-cash gifts?

Yes. You may consider donating cars, crops, land, or other items of value. Contributing stocks, bonds, and mutual funds that have been held for at least a year and have appreciated provide special tax advantages. Donors will receive a tax deduction for the full market value of the gift, but you will not have to pay capital gains tax on the appreciated amount. If you sell depreciated stock and contribute the proceeds to the parish, you will receive both a tax deduction for the gift and a deduction for the capital loss.

Please consult your tax advisor or accountant to determine the best way to make a donation and take advantage of your tax savings.



Q: Will the new additions look like what we saw in the video or in the last newsletter?

The images used in the video and newsletter were provided to give us an idea of what the space COULD look

like. As more details become available, we will share them with the parish. The locations of the additions are close to where the additions will end up.

Q: What is the financial condition of the parish?

In general, the parish is doing OK. This year, we budgeted giving of \$260,000 to conclude our Phase I campaign and \$560,000 to support our parish operating budget through tithing. So far, tithing is behind the budget, and parish staff are managing expenses very tightly to minimize the impact to parishioners. These are the budgeted expenses:

- ◆ \$200,000 for running the parish – salaries, utilities, maintenance
- ◆ \$175,000 for interest portion of the mortgage
- ◆ \$175,000 to principal – currently a \$5.5M balance (This is paid out of our capital campaign funds)
- ◆ \$135,000 for parish's support of the school
- ◆ \$50,000 for parish's support of Faith Formation & Religious Education

Q: When can we start construction of Phase II?

The diocese requires that we have at least 50% of the money needed collected and the other 50% committed.

Q: Will we get rid of the mobile classrooms in Phase II?

If we raise the total needed, \$4.9 million, then we sell the mobile classrooms. The city has issued us a 5-year permit for the mobile classrooms.

Q: When do we start our contributions to the campaign?

You will have three years to complete your commitment starting the first of June 2018.

Q: What happens if we only raise \$2.5 million?

To complete the entire Phase II project, we will need to raise a total of \$4.9 million. With this amount, we can construct an additional 10 classrooms which will prepare us for the anticipated growth through the 2025 school year. If we only raise \$2.5 million, we will complete as much of the Phase II expansion as our funds allow. We will not go further into debt. However, we will eventually need to build the remaining classrooms for our growing school and RE program.

Q: Will we need to do more capital campaigns?

Eventually, we will need to raise money for our permanent church that is planned just to the east of our current church. No timetable has been set for the permanent church. We will wait until the parish grows to the size necessary to afford a new church.

If we can't raise the total of \$4.9 million needed to complete all of Phase II in this campaign, we may possibly need to consider another campaign in the near future.

Q: How will we measure the success of our campaign?

We will judge our success by:

1. The amount of money raised to fund Phase II of our parish long-range expansion plan.
2. How well we have enhanced our parish's sense of community.
3. Parishioners' understanding and practice of the transformative power of stewardship.

Include Your Children in the Commitment Decision

Determining your level of commitment to the campaign is a big decision. For some, it will be the largest gift of money they will have ever made. It is important to include the entire family in the decision process. Talk with your children about why you want to participate in the campaign and invite them to do something special to participate, remembering that all that we have is a gift from God and we are called to use our gifts to make the world a better place.
