Along with that I think we need, as part of our t-shirt order, to order XXL and XXXL sizes, probably 3 of each, along with our other sizes that we’re running short on. I’d like to get authorization to order these items as soon as possible. Also, if we change our apparel provider, we could get many items cheaper. I have attached my Excel file that compares our costs for our various items and what they cost. I think our best bet would be “Logo-ed Apparel”. Our polo shirts and fleeces would be a little more expensive, but our caps and button-downs would be significantly less. Our t-shirts would be around \$1 more. We could send out to Logo-ed Apparel and P&M for new bids and see what they come back with. It’s up to you and the officers.”
