
ST. LUKE THE EVANGELIST CATHOLIC PARISH



A Message From Fr. Ken

About a year ago, Bishop Pates called and asked if I would be willing to come to Ankeny and become the pastor at St. Luke. I have to admit, I was hesitant, not because I didn't want to come here, but because I didn't want to leave where I was at. While it has not been easy, it has been a blessed experience. Looking at the numbers I averaged 27 funerals and 14 baptisms a year in Creston and Afton, and I do many more baptisms a year here than funerals and what a wonderful thing. One of the greatest blessings that we have here is the sheer number of children around, and they are our present and future of the Church. The present, because they are here and are celebrating with us, and the future because with all of our help and guidance, they will be here in the future, continuing to build their relationship with God.



I have a couple of phrases that I often use. The first is that the primary mission of the Church is to bring all people to God. This is accomplished by both teaching about God, as well as living out the discipleship of Christ in our deeds and actions.

The second phrase I often use is to trust in God and everything will work out. I have tried to live this message out each and every day, even though I can still fall into worry about so many things, I really know in my heart that if we are living out the mission of leading people to Christ and doing the work, God will help us and everything will work out in the way that He wants. So as we see the many things that we do in this parish, I invite each and every one of us to pray and ask God where He is calling us, and have that courage to follow Him in the mission of being Christ's representative in the world each and every day.







Tithe of the Tithe

The Lord said to Moses: Speak to the Levites and say to them: When you take from the Israelites the tithes I have assigned you from them as your heritage, you are to make a contribution from them to the Lord, a tithe of the tithe. (Numbers 18:25-26)

Stewardship and helping God's people is an important priority of St. Luke's. Each month, St. Luke's takes 10% of parishioner tithing and donates it to charities and those in need in our community & world. This is called "Tithe of the Tithe". The Social Concerns and Stewardship Committees alternate months of allocating funds.

St. Luke's has Reverse Collections regularly. Parishioners are called upon to donate diapers, winter hats, school supplies, and Christmas presents for needy families. But you may not have known that the money you put in the weekly collection baskets reaches the world!

In 2019 the Tithe of the Tither contributed over \$47,000 to various organizations. The Social Concerns Committee determines which organizations receive the tithe of the tithe funds.




NEW WOMEN'S GROUPS FORMED


